

Buying a used car: Checklist

1 Condition of vehicle

1.1 Outer chassis

1.1.1 Paintwork

- Is the paintwork in a good general condition, is there paint damage (scratches or repairs)?
- Are there paint marks on the tires, on the underbody protection (e.g. wheel housings), or in the rubber door and window seals?

1.1.2 Side panels

Are the surfaces and edge lines wavy? Are color differences, paint changes, dull spots, or rust visible?

1.1.3 Underbody

• Has the underbody of the vehicle been post-treated with preservatives on its underbody protection, its door sills or its fender edges?

1.1.4 Gap dimensions

• Are the gap dimensions (distances and clearances) of the doors and hoods equal?

1.1.5 Lighting

- Is the lighting working and are the lighting units undamaged?
- Are the headlights, direction indicators, taillights and the electronic system monitoring all functioning correctly?

1.1.6 Glass

• Are the windows damage-free? Are stone chippings, scratches or cracks visible?

1.1.7 Tires

- Are the tire treads still adequate (legal minimum 1.6mm / recommended above 3 mm)?
- Are the tires undamaged and not too old (porous rubber spots, bubbles on the sidewall)?
- Is the wear of the tires even (differences in condition, damage to the sidewalls, one-sided tread wear)?
- Are all the tires on the vehicle of the same brand, and do they match the vehicle in terms of its size and maximum permissible speed?

1.1.8 Wheel rims and covers

- Are the wheel rims in good general condition (damage, rim edges, cracks)?
- Are all the wheel covers in good condition? Check that any special rims or post-mounted rims have been noted in the vehicle registration document as approved changes.

1.1.9 Chrome, trim and rubber seals

• Are these undamaged?

1.1.10 Brake disks

- Optical check of the brake discs. Is damage to the brake discs visible?
- Wear pattern in good condition (surface rust, grooves, etc.)?
- Are the brake discs visibly worn, possibly through to the brake lining?

1.2 Interior

- 1.2.1 Check operation of the electronic equipment
 - Is the electronic equipment working properly, e.g. the windshield wipers, the heating, the ventilation and air conditioning system, the navigation system, the comfort electronics, and the on-board computer systems?
 - Do the electric mirrors, the seat adjustment and the electric windows and sunroof work?

1.2.2 Interior fittings

- Seats: Are the seats worn or dirty? Can they be easily adjusted?
- Doors: Do the doors close precisely? Are rubber seals missing, are they cracked or porous?
- Are there burn holes, cracks or damage in the seat covers, door panels or roof linings?

1.2.3 Restraint systems

- Are the safety belts undamaged and do they slide properly?
- Has the useful life of the airbags expired?

1.2.4 Passenger area

- General appearance, cleanliness, are traces of excessive use recognizable?
- Odors, smoker vehicle, dog, etc?

1.2.5 Pedals

• Are the rubber pedal pads worn or brand new?

1.2.6 Floor carpets

• Are the floor carpets dry, clean and undamaged?

1.3 Engine

1.3.1 General

- Is external oil or coolant leakage noticeable from the engine and auxiliary components?
- Are there any paint resprays or rust spots?

1.3.2 Battery

- Is the battery fixed? Are the battery terminals oxidized?
- Are the fluid levels of the units in the engine correct, e.g. the cooling system, oil system, etc?
- Are the visible rubber sleeves for the drive shafts and the steering undamaged, e.g. marten damage?

1.3.3 Operating performance of the engine

- Is the running of the engine correct?
- Can you hear excessive or abnormal engine noise?

1.3.4 Timing belts

• Was the last change of the timing belt carried out according to the specifications or is a change due?

1.4 Interior of the trunk

- Are traces of repair visible? Are there any paint resprays or rust spots?
- Are covers and floor mats dry and undamaged? Is there dampness under the floor mats, etc.?
- Are the spare wheel and vehicle tool kit (car jack, etc) present?

1.5 Undercarriage (if possible in a raised position)

1.5.1 Underside

- Is there remedied repair damage?
- Are rust spots visible on the floor assembly, the undersides of the doors and hoods?
- Is damage to the underbody protection visible?

1.5.2 Tightness of the units

• Is a loss of oil from the engine, gearbox, differential or steering recognizable?

1.5.3 Exhaust system

- Is significant rust or damage to the exhaust pipes and muffler recognizable?
- Is the catalytic converter in good condition (rigid inner parts, external deformities, etc)?

1.5.4 Chassis

- Is there recognizable damage to the wheel suspensions or the chassis?
- Has a modified chassis been entered correctly in the vehicle registration document?

1.5.5 Shock absorber / spring elements

• Is the tightness correct or is oil loss visible?

1.5.6 Braking system and fuel system

• Are leaky spots (traces of dampness) visible?

2 Inspection of documents

2.1 Vehicle registration

- Date of first registration
- Compare the engine and chassis numbers
- Motor vehicle control: When was the vehicle last officially tested? Place importance on the fact that the vehicle has been officially tested in at least the last 6 months.
- Has all maintenance work has been carried out in accordance with the specifications of the vehicle manufacturer?

2.2 Service booklet

- Signed and stamped?
- Date and mileage noted?
- Have all services been carried out in accordance with the factory specifications?

2.3 Exhaust maintenance document

• When was the last exhaust emission test carried out?

3 Purchase contract

3.1 General

- For contract negotiations on site, it is advisable to take a neutral person with you so that you have a witness in case of any subsequent disputes with the seller.
- Ask to see the sales authorization or canceled vehicle registration if the seller is not the owner of the vehicle.
- If the seller fails to provide sufficient vehicle information, request an excerpt of the vehicle's history from the Federal Roads Office (ASTRA, 3003 Bern).
- Before concluding the contract, check that the information contained therein matches that in the vehicle's papers or the vehicle itself.

3.2 Contract form

 Although verbal purchase contracts are valid, completion of contracts in writing is nonetheless recommended for evidentiary purposes. You must be in possession of a duplicate of the contract signed by both parties.

3.3 The contract contents

- The parties and their addresses, purchase price
- Vehicle (brand, model, model year, age, chassis number, date of 1st registration, mileage, accessories)
- Additional elements (warranty, guarantee, accident freedom, from first owner, from motor vehicle control, risk only upon delivery of the vehicle, etc).
