


# Photo documentation

# Photo tips from our vehicle experts


# Only the car should be in the picture.

Take the picture from a significant distance.



### **Overview photos**

Take the picture at nose-height.



For larger damage or in the case of total loss, take a picture of all four diagonals – for minor damage at least two.



Overview photo, at a 45-degree angle, the entire vehicle front and right side



Overview photo, at a 45-degree angle, the entire back of the vehicle and right side



Overview photo, at a 45-degree angle, the entire vehicle front and left side


Speedometer including odometer reading

## **Detailed photos**

Take the pictures horizontally



Take pictures of the current damage as well as any potential previous damage.

#### Note

Through the order of the pictures – first the vehicle overview / full overview of the damage, then the detailed pictures – the damaged area and scope of the concrete effects on the vehicle / vehicle structure should be clearly recognizable in the pictures.

Please designate / mark / label (possibly on the computer), if necessary, the corresponding damage.

Panel gap size

Take a picture of all panel gaps – especially if there has been a noticeable change (with a corresponding description)



**Seatbelts**Seatbelts



Traces of strain on the belt buckle

## Note on seatbelts:

- If a seatbelt hangs tight from the anchor: Pull the belt tight, take a picture and add a text comment
- Take a picture of the retracted seatbelt
- If, despite the tightening, the seatbelt can still be used and pulled out/retracted (possibly with a noticeable sound): Pull out the seat belt and take a picture (and, where applicable, document that the belt tensioner was deployed)





Airbag

Airbag system deployed (put the airbag back in its compartment before taking pictures)

**Repair history**Please also submit the detailed photos of the repairs with the repair invoices.
